

A.K.TEK IN HAGEN RELIES ON SCHWANOG'S EXPERTISE WITH INSERTABLE THREAD WHIRLING TOOLS.



The company A.K. TEK is a competent development and manufacturing partner in the medical sector, particularly for the dental implantology as well as for endoscopic and spine surgery. With a pioneering spirit and curiosity, the company closely cooperates with surgeons, clinics, and institutes.

The team from A.K. TEK is mainly composed of professionals with multiple qualifications. In addition to basic metalworking expertise, they have undergone additional training or studies. They are highly qualified technicians in the manufacture of medical products with many years of experience.

A.K.TEK designs the manufacturing process in its entirety, from blueprint to finished product. The team is trained in terms of products and processes, and takes an integrated-process approach to machining, materials, applications and technologies.

A.K. TEK managing director Michael Arndt describes the philosophy as follows:

"Every day is learning for us. We analyze natural forces, such as those that make the jaw effective for chewing. These are miniature products that serve as substitutes for something that has been lost in a human body.

Manufacturing processes include turning and milling, wire-cutting, plastic injection molding, laser welding and laser marking, and labeling.

In its production facility, A.K. TEK has been relying on the cooperation with Schwanog for over 13 years. The company makes use of Schwanog's expertise with insertable whirling tools in various designs. Before the partnership with Schwanog, whirling systems from other manufacturers were used. The switch to Schwanog was initially made with the intention of lowering unit costs and reducing set-up and ancillary costs.





Franck Manera, new head of Schwanog France


