

KHK Group uses Schwanog insertable form drills:

REDUCTION OF PRODUCTION TIME BY 39%!

The KHK Group, consisting of Gerd Krüger Maschinenbau GmbH, Industriebedarf Krüger GmbH, and Czetec spol sro has positioned itself, since the company was founded in 1961, as a proven specialist in rotary and swivel screw connections as well as in the manufacture of hydraulic valve blocks for high-quality precision parts.

At the company headquarters in Brockel, Lower Saxony, and the production site of Czetec spol. sro in the Czech Republic, about 50 employees produce high-quality parts for the hydraulic industry. Materials such as aluminum, steel, and stainless steel are mainly used

Rotary and swivel screw connections are core competence.

The core competence of the KHK Group are rotary and swivel screw connections for almost every medium, every connection, and every size. The medium-sized company structure offers the asset of high flexibility in manufacturing individually dimensioned rotary and swivel screw connections which can also be adapted to the respective customer specifications.

Another success factor for owner and managing director Karlheinz Krüger is the consistent focus on 100% quality made in Europe, paired with decades of experience and highly qualified employees. The necessary purchased vendor parts are obtained exclusively from leading brand manufacturers with the same quality philosophy. Before delivery, every rotary and swivel screw connection are consistently tested for 100% leakage.

Cooperation with Schwanog since 2019.

The cooperation with Schwanog started around two years ago and has been highly worthwhile thanks to the enormous increases in productivity. Due to the know-how and advice from Schwanog's technical sales representative, Klaus Rosenfeld, KHK Group has been convinced to use Schwanog insertable form drills.

Schwanog PWP insertable form drills are used for the complete machining of valve blocks. The result not only impressed the whole team of managing director and project manager Karlheinz Krüger, but also met the previously projected savings potential.



Managing director Karlheinz Krüger is enthusiastic:

"By using Schwanog insertable form drills, we were able to reduce the production time for the entire valve block by 39%. Also, we are impressed by the enormous process reliability with constant compliance of the manufacturing tolerances as well as the first-class, lasting surface finish quality in the sealing area of the bore."

According to Karlheinz Krüger, the production time required for machining, prior to converting to Schwanog form drills, was 14 minutes for a complete component. With the Schwanog PWP insertable form drills, the machining time could be reduced to 8.5 minutes while maintaining highest process reliability at the finishing process of the part, without the need of a post process.

Another benefit is the long tool life of the PWP insertable tools of 800 drill holes, which is significant for the economic series production of the KHK Group.

Regarding these first-class results, fast response time, and on-site service, we will always consult Schwanog in future projects, according to Karlheinz Krüger.






